To date Alicia has secured over \$120 million for social enterprises globally— the majority of which are enterprises created and managed by underrepresented founders. In 2022 she relaunched her consulting practice, DeLia Impact Advisors, to leverage her expertise and networks to advance social entrepreneurship and impact investing worldwide.

As an advocate, speaker and thought leader, Alicia frequently hosts global convenings around themes of trust based philanthropy, restorative investing, racial equity investing, international economic development and gender lens investing.
